CNGA will be holding a California grasslands photography exhibit during the 2008 Annual Conference in Santa Rosa this May 2008. We are welcoming digital images of native grasslands and grassland species from the diverse natural and developed landscapes of California. Twenty finalists will be selected for exhibition at the Conference on May 2, 2008. A prize will be awarded to the Best of Show as selected by Conference participants. Finalist photos may be featured on CNGA’s website, www.CNGA.org, journal, and other publications.

Submit photographs of:

- ↪ native California grasslands during various seasons and from different locations in California, or individual native grass and forb species.
- ↪ bird, animal, insect, and reptile residents of native grasslands.
- ↪ landscapes, agriculture, ranching, and revegetation projects with a significant native grass component.

TO ENTER:

The competition is open to all photographers age 18 or older (under 18 with signed parental consent to exhibit). Enter one or more images of between 3-8 megapixels. E-mail each photo, one at a time, to (CNGA.photo08@yahoo.com). Include in the email text your name, address, phone, and the photo location, approximate date of photo, any other pertinent information about the photograph, and acknowledgment that you are familiar with the submission rules and agreement. All images must be submitted by on or before March 15, 2008.

Submission Rules & Agreement—PLEASE READ:

Photo finalists will be displayed at the Annual Meeting. All exhibit finalists will be credited with the Photographer’s Name.

By entering, participants warrant that his or her entry materials are original, do not infringe on any third party’s copyright, privacy, or publicity rights, and that the participant has obtained any necessary permissions from any third party.

Photo processing costs to prepare the photograph in approximately 8X10” size for exhibition will be paid by CNGA.

The submitter retains ownership to their original photograph other than rights allowed to CNGA as follows. Finalists allow the California Native Grasslands Association (CNGA) a nonexclusive, royalty-free right to reproduce, distribute, and publicly display the photograph(s) you submit in the organization’s promotions and publications. CNGA would have the right to use your name, city, and state of residence in CNGA promotions and publications. Also, CNGA has final approval of any language that appears on its Web site or publications with any of the submitted photos.
