Submission deadlines:

Winter Issue	October 15
Spring Issue	January 15
Summer Issue	April 15
Fall Issue	July 15

Submissions: Please submit articles and any e-mail attachments to the *Grasslands* Editorial Chair at grasslands@cnga.org.

Submission Guidelines: The Basics

Formatting: Times New Roman, 12 pt font; double-spaced with no paragraph formatting; ALL text in upper/lower case (no all-upper-case lettering please). Send Microsoft Word files. Spell out non-measurement numbers from one to nine and use numerals for 10 and above. Use numerals for measurements (e.g., 3 inches/feet/years) whether under or over 10.

Be sure to include: A byline with author name(s), title(s), affiliation(s), and biographical information (one or two sentences) for each author.

Photos, tables, figures, art: For photos, we require at least 300 dpi; everything we print is in black and white except covers (so format graphs and tables accordingly). Send all items as email attachments (not imbedded within Word document). Include captions and appropriate credits.

Reviewers: Please suggest two potential reviewers for your article, including name, title, and affiliation, as well as professional email address.

References: For in-text citations use, e.g., (Jones 2004), (Doe and Johnson 2005), (Smith et al. 2007); for multiple citations, separate with a comma, and list by date starting with oldest (Jones 2004, Doe and Johnson 2005, Smith et al. 2007). Include all names unless there are more than eight co-authors; otherwise, use "et al." format (Smith et al.) and follow the format below for the remainder.
